1 Welcome

5 Future plans for the APPG

Victoria Prentis MP asked Frances Crook, CEO of the Howard League to introduce plans for the APPG. Frances Crook reported that in the forthcoming year the APPG would be conducting two inquiries simultaneously. It was currently conducting an Inquiry on reducing the arrests of women. It would also begin an inquiry on sentencing following on from the previous work of the APPG. Frances Crook introduced Miranda Bevan who would be leading on the work on the sentencing of women.

It was suggested the APPG would hold two meetings per parliamentary session. One session would focus on reducing arrests and the other would look at the sentencing of women. The Howard League provided administrative support to the APPG and could provide funding to support the work of the two inquiries.

It was noted that by focusing on keeping women out of the criminal justice and penal systems completely it obviated the need to focus on resettlement or prison conditions by avoiding custody altogether.

6 Preparation for evidence session: Inquiry on reducing arrests Victoria Prentis asked APPG members to decide what questions they would like to ask the witnesses from the Nelson Trust at the evidence session. Questions were allocated to parliamentarians.
