

Call for Peer Researchers

The Howard League's *Commission on Crime and Problem Gambling* is undertaking two research projects about crime and gamblingrelated harms. One focuses on the lived experiences of women, and the second on the lived experiences of people from ethnic minority communities. The overarching goal of the research is to develop a knowledge base within the criminal justice system that recognises women's and ethnic minorities' experiences of gambling-related harms and their needs, thus lowering the potential for criminal justice interventions in the future.

These are peer research projects, which means that women and people from ethnic minority communities are not only involved as research participants, sharing their thoughts and experiences, but also as researchers, helping shape and implement the projects.
